RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to participate in all consultations and meetings sponsored by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Education Programs; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Eduction, will conduct a budget formulation meeting on November 13-14, 1991, in Reno Nevada; and
- WHEREAS, tribal government and school board involvement in the budget process is imperative in the budget process in order to establish their priorities for FY 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Education Department and tribal Council did not receive budget formation and priorities for FY 1994, until November 4, 1991; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council and Education Department believe that it is extremely important that the budget process and priorities for Fy 1994, be thoroughly reviewed, analyzed, and considered by the tribe, grant schools and the BIA School Board in order to adequately complete the attached priority list.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that opportunities for tribal involvement be extended until January 1992 and that other such late requests for the tribe be equally treated to insure true and effective tribal participation in the very important issue of education for our children.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby protests the inadequate time provided in which to prepare priorities for the November 13-14, 1991 budget formulation meeting.

The foregoing resolution was on November 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
