RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Councilmember Kino Kane from District II has requested that the Tribal Council authorize FATCO to donate sufficient hog lumber to construct a school bus stop enclosure at Hondah, to provide protection for school children while waiting for the school bus in inclement weather; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that Virgil Hinton, Jr. has volunteered to construct the school bus shelter for the children if a donation of hog lumber can be obtained; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with the request and commends Virgil Hinton, Jr. for his offer to construct the shelter for the school children.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs and authorizes the Fort Apache Timber Company to donate sufficient hog lumber for construction of a shelter for school children at Hondah.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes and directs Councilmember Kino Kane to be responsible for carrying out this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby commends the generosity of Virgil Hinton, Jr. who has volunteered to construct, at no cost, the shelter for school children at Hondah.

The foregoing resolution was on November 08, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and one against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
