## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, District II Councilmember Kino Kane has advised the Tribal Council that there is a serious erosion problem behind the homesite of Ross Susan, specifically, that during rain storms, mud and water flood the Susans' homesite area; and
- WHEREAS, Councilmember Kino Kane is requesting assistance from the Council to correct the erosion problem, and further advises that BIA Superintendent Ben Nuvamsa has been advised of the problem existing in Cedar Creek; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Chairman Lupe should be directed to request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to assist Cedar Creek in this on-going problem.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Chairman Ronnie Lupe to request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to take action to correct the erosion problem existing at Cedar Creek which is causing mud and water to flow onto the homesite area and property of the Ross Susan family.

The foregoing resolution was on November 08, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
