RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, District III Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr. advises the Tribal Council that presently FATCO wood products are not being utilized in Indian housing construction projects on the reservation despite the proximity of the sawmill to the housing projects; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Massey is requesting that the Tribal Council pass a resolution directing the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to utilize FATCO wood products in all future housing developments on the reservation pursuant to the Buy Indian Act and other regulations which require that preference be given to Indian companies and products for federally funded projects especially those involving Indian tribes or persons; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Mr. Massey's request should be granted.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to take what steps are necessary to insure that FATCO wood products are eligible for utilization on all future HUD financed Indian housing projects on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on November 08, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and ten against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
