RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Cibecue Community High School construction project had been requested by the Community School Board to be prioritized for FY 92; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council was advised that the application for construction was not selected for FY 92; and
- WHEREAS, there is an overdue need for construction of a High School in Cibecue due to the tremendous student drop out problem in that community and the fact that students must commute more than 100 miles every day to attend high school; and
- WHEREAS, based thereon and other facts and circumstances put forth in the construction application filed by the Cibecue Community School Board, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe concludes that the Bureau of Indian Affairs should prioritize the Cibecue High School construction for FY 92.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Agency Superintendent of Education and the Phoenix Area Office Director petition the Bureau of Indian Affairs to prioritize construction of the Cibecue High School for FY 92.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests the assistance of the Arizona Congressional Delegation to prioritize construction of this gravely needed high school for FY 92.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 18, 1991</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
