

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is approximately \$90,000 remaining in the General Land Claims fund presently under the administration of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Fort Apache Agency; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau wishes to transfer administration of the fund to the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is agreeable to the transfer and to an equal distribution of the remaining balance in the General Land Claims to the communities of Seven Mile, Cedar Creek, Cibecue, Carrizo, Forestdale, Canyon Day, Diamond Creek, McNary and Whiteriver, except for East Fork as it has already received its equal share of the remaining General Land Claims Fund and that the Tribal Business Office administer the fund for each community.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the administration of the remaining balance of the General Land Claims Fund be transferred from the 'Bureau of Indian Affairs to the Tribal Business Office.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs that the Tribal Treasurer distribute equally amongst the Communities of Seven Mile, Cedar Creek, Cibecue, Carrizo, Forestdale, Canyon Day, Diamond Creek, McNary and Whiteriver with the exception of East Fork Community which has already received its equal share.

The foregoing resolution was on March 18, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
