

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, tribal member, Viola Way came before the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in July, 1988 requesting that repairs be made to her HIP home, as there were plumbing leaks which were causing damage to the floors; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council adopted Resolution No. 07-88-194 which directed HIP to take corrective measures to repair Mrs. Way's home and such repairs were never effected; and

WHEREAS, Viola Way has again requested that repairs be made on her HIP home so that she can move back to her home before this year's winter; and advises that she has purchased materials to make the repairs but has been unable to find someone to do the work; and

WHEREAS, the Director of JTPA has indicated that JTPA workers can provide the labor to make the repairs on Viola Way's home, and to repair the floors which have been damaged by leaking plumbing; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe concurs that JTPA workers should be directed to make the repairs to Mrs. Way's HIP home, as they are already involved in the HIP Program building new homes, and have the ability to do the work and make the necessary repairs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the JTPA program to make the necessary repairs on Mrs. Viola Way's HIP home in an expedient manner, so that Mrs. Way can move back into her home before the onset of winter weather.

The foregoing resolution was on August 06, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
