

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** Ms. Lucille Willie has come before the Tribal Council and has advised that she still does not have access to her home and that direct access to her home is blocked by another family's dwelling; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council by previous resolution attempted to resolve the problem and conflicts but further action is now deemed necessary; and

**WHEREAS,** it is suggested that the BIA be granted a right-of-way on the access road to Ms. Willies' home and that it be graveled which will cure the current access problem that Ms. Willie is suffering; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council concurs in this suggestion.


**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a right-of-way on the access road to Ms. Lucille Willie's home.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs immediately gravel the road to Ms. Willie's home pending final execution of right-of-way documents.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman and in his absence, the Vice Chairman is authorized to execute any right-of-way documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on November 04, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
