RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, American Indians have served gallantly and unselfishly in the armed forces of the United States in World War II, the Korean Conflict, the Vietnam War, and Operation Desert Storm; and
- WHEREAS, many members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe have served in the foregoing wars and conflicts; and
- WHEREAS, several veterans are buried at the Whiteriver Cemetery on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that military surplus is available for display purposes; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council would like to obtain a surplus cannon to be placed at the Whiteriver Cemetery and a surplus military airplane to be displayed at the Memorial Hall as a memorial to the White Mountain Apache War Veterans.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby delegates Vice Chairman Lafe Altaha to meet with Senator John McCain for the purposes of obtaining a surplus cannon and military airplane as a memorial to the White Mountain Apache War Veterans.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby respectfully requests Senator John McCain's assistance in acquiring the foregoing military surplus to honor the White Mountain Apache War Veterans.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>November 05, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
