

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the section of Highway 73 across from the Williams Creek turnoff often remains icy and dangerous because of the tree canopy cover near the road; and

WHEREAS, Tribal Councilmember Kino Kane has brought this matter to the attention of the Tribal Council and requests that in the interest of safety that Tribal Forestry and the Bureau of Indian Affairs be granted authority to cut trees along the highway across from the Williams Creek turnoff in order to facilitate the melting of snow and ice presently blocked by tree canopy; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with the request and the reasons therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Tribal Forestry and BIA Forestry to cut trees necessary along Route 73 across from the Williams Creek turnoff in order to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on December 02, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
