

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council has been advised that the roads leading to the homes of tribal members Janice Charley, Naomi Harrina and Merle Pusher and those tribal members identified in Resolution No. 11-92-311 are in dire need of repair; and


**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council concurs that the BIA should be granted a right-of-way on each road leading to the above tribal members' homes for the purpose of graveling the roads.


**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a right-of-way on the roads leading to the homes of tribal members Janice Charley, Naomi Harrina, Merle Pusher and any other roads which have been identified in previous resolutions as needing repair by the Bureau.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs immediately gravel the roads leading to the above-mentioned tribal members homes and those identified in Resolution No. 11-92-311.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman and in his absence, the Vice-Chairman is authorized to execute any right-of-way documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
