


**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**


- WHEREAS,** Tribal member Rosie Foster has come before the Tribal Council seeking assistance to obtain housing for herself and her parents; and
- WHEREAS,** Ms. Foster's parents are currently living at Pueblo Norte Nursing Home because Ms. Foster does not have adequate housing to care for them; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council is advised that Ms. Foster would like to care for her parents at home and has requested housing from the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority that would be adequate for her and her parents to live in; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council sees that Ms. Foster's situation as an emergency and concurs that she should receive priority for rental housing.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Executive Director of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to consider Ms. Foster's application for emergency housing, and that she be assigned a rental unit adequate to house her and her parents.

The foregoing resolution was on January 06, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
