## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe adopted Resolution No. 12-93-343 on December 02, 1992, WHEREAS, the Miscellaneous Forest Products Ordinance No. 181; and
- Ordinance No. 181 Section 1.9, Firewood Cutting; Species Designated; Resale says: "Alligator Juniper products WHEREAS, shall not be harvested for resale by anyone"; and
- many tribal members are not able to cut their own Alligator Juniper firewood and therefore must purchase WHEREAS, their Alligator Juniper from other tribal members.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby directs that the last sentence in Section 1.9 be deleted and replaced by the following provision:

"Alligator Juniper firewood may be harvested by enrolled members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for resale to enrolled members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, but shall not be harvested for resale to non-tribal members or to anyone off the Fort Apache Indian Reservation."

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 12, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of  $\underline{\text{six}}$  for and  $\underline{\text{zero}}$  against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
