RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, District III Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr. advises the Tribal Council that due to the recent heavy rainfall, the bridge at Quintero Springs has been washed out; and
- WHEREAS, several tribal members living in the upper East Fork community are now unable to cross the river to get to their homes; and
- WHEREAS, this situation is creating a hardship for the people living in the upper East Fork area and therefore should be addressed immediately.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby requests that the Roads Department
 of the Bureau of Indian Affairs repair or build a
 permanent bridge at Quintero Springs crossing.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests that this project be listed as a priority due to the hardship created for tribal members living in the upper East Fork community.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 12, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>five</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
