RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the parents of Raymond Burnette, Abel and Minnie Burnette have come before the Tribal Council and have advised the Tribal Council that their son, Raymond, relinquished his Mutual Help Home Unit after his divorce, although he had resided in the home for nine years; and
- WHEREAS, the relinquishment, which the parents state was done under duress, caused the property to revert back to the Tribal Housing Authority; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Abel Burnette have requested that their other son, Lloyd Burnette, be assigned the home, and have asked Tribal Council intervention to do so; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council is also advised that Lloyd Burnette presently resides in Phoenix and that the Housing Authority has attempted to work with the family and Lloyd Burnette, but there was a question as to whether or not Lloyd Burnette was truly interested in the home; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Burnette further advise the Council that they have thirteen grandchildren who come to their three-bedroom house, which is inadequate and another home is necessary; and
- WHEREAS, the Council is also advised that the home has been reassigned to another tribal member who also is in need; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Tribal Housing Authority Commissioners and the Housing Authority administration should complete a prompt review of all of the interests described herein and advise the Tribal Council in writing as to their conclusions and recommendations and the reasons therefore.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Tribal Housing Authority Board of Commissioners and its Director to review the situation described in this resolution and to report back in writing recommendations and findings of fact with the goal of resolving the present situation and claims.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>March 03, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against and <u>one</u> abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) (s) (t) (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
