RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that there is approximately \$168,000 in carry-over funds available for the FY 1993 Tribal Court/Judicial Services budget in addition to \$317,000 contract funding; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council recognizes the importance of improving and maintaining the Tribe's judicial capabilities at a level which will insure speedy and impartial adjudication of violations of tribal laws and resolution of civil disputes, and that the surplus funds will allow the White Mountain Apache Tribe to expand and enhance the services provided by its tribal courts; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council has considered the most urgent needs of the Tribe and concludes that the attached Tribal Court/Judicial Services budget for FY 1993 should be approved.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the attached Tribal Court/Judicial Services budget.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the attached budget be submitted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for approval.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Treasurer shall direct the Tribal Grants and Contracts Office to immediately establish and implement a line item budget for the Tribal Court/Judicial Services FY 93 Budget.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 07, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
