

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has authorized applications to the State Historic Preservation Office and to BIA for funding a Master Plan for the Fort Apache Historic site; and

WHEREAS, the consultant is working on said plan and will report to the Council in May; and

WHEREAS, the National Park service has announced that as part of the Rebuild America Program that a funding opportunity for preservation of historic properties exists with applications due on April 30, 1993 work to be initiated on June 1, 1993 and to be completed by September 30, 1993; and


WHEREAS, the primary purpose of the program is employment; and


WHEREAS, the JTPA program has agreed to supply manpower to the project if funding for material and supervision by a qualified historic preservation professional can be otherwise funded;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Planning Department to prepare a grant application for up to \$50,000 in National Park Service funds to preserve the building known as Crook's Quarters, now housing the Apache Cultural Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the funds be used for material, supervision, and indirect costs and that labor be provided by the JTPA program with no match to be provided by the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 12, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
