**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 02-91-60, dated February 21, 1991, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requested that community streets be reconstructed; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous right-of-way of 80 feet wide for a length of 3.231 miles as shown on right-of-way drawings as follows:

R/W Dwg. No. FA-1-17	Length = 0.282 mile
R/W Dwg. No. FA-1-18	Length = 1.109 mile
R/W Dwg. No. FA-2-1	Length = 0.539 mile
R/W Dwg. No. FA-2-2	Length = 0.546 mile
R/W Dwg. No. FA-4-5	Length = 0.755 mile

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous right-of-way as described herein and recorded on Right-of-Way Drawings on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on May 05, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
