RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the Headstart Program will be submitting a new grant application that establishes a three-year cycle, that requires a long, comprehensive application for the first year and shorter versions for the other two years; and
- WHEREAS, the Community Needs Assessment is an integral part of Headstart's overall planning and is needed to complete the new grant applications due in August, 1993; and
- WHEREAS, this Community Needs Assessment must be submitted prior to the submission of the grant application.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses the Headstart Program effort to conduct the Community Needs Assessment to includes all the communities in Whiteriver, Cibecue, Carrizo and McNary as required by the on-going funding regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>May 05, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
