## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Councilmember Johnny Endfield has advised the Tribal Council that several land assignments to tribal members in the North Fork community are situated too close to the North Fork Cemetery; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Endfield also advises the Council that due to the proximity of the surrounding land assignments, any future expansion of the North Fork cemetery will not be possible; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that this issue must be addressed immediately.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Raymus Albert of the Tribal Land Office, to negotiate land assignments in the vicinity of the North Fork cemetery in order to allow more space for future expansion of the cemetery.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 12, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
