- the White Mountain Apache Tribe is a federally recognized WHEREAS, Indian Tribe organize pursuant to the provisions of Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 State. 094); and
- Arizona Senate Bill 1329 and A.R.S. 41-1521 through 41-WHEREAS, 1528 authorized the establishment of enterprise zones in Arizona; and
- the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is concerned WHEREAS, about the high unemployment rate and poverty level on the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation surrounding areas; and
- the Tribal Council desires to enhance and strengthen WHEREAS, local efforts to promote economic development and diversification.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses the creation of Gila County Enterprise Zone and pledges to work with the Gila County Board of Supervisors toward the success of the program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
