RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- the Fort Apache Historic Park Master Plan has been WHEREAS, adopted by the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS. the State Office of Historic Preservation has announced that grant funds are available for preserving historic structures; and
- WHEREAS, the building known as Crook's Cabin is in need of preservation treatment to prevent its destruction from weather, poor drainage, and age; and
- a detailed cost estimate complied by an historic WHEREAS, architect and structural engineer reveal that the costs of preservation will exceed \$130,000; and
- WHEREAS, the grant requires a match of 40% of the costs and the Tribal JTPA program is ready, willing and qualified to perform the work under the supervision of a qualified historic preservation professional is the necessary supplies, tools and administration are provided.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it approves submission of a grant application for funding to accomplish the preservation of Crook's Cabin.

The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (h) (i) (j) (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
