## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the White Mountain Apache Tribe by Resolution 06-93-173 states its intention that the facility known as the old nurses quarters, declared surplus by IHS, be used for the purposes of serving the youth of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Head Start Program to accommodate its expansion by an additional sixty (60) students for the next school year needs additional space for classrooms and for parent training; and
- WHEREAS, the Robert Wood Johnson Healthy Nation proposal includes parent education and training as an important component of the overall program; and
- WHEREAS, the federal Head Start program will provide funding to accommodate the expansion of the program and renovate the building for Head Start purposes.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby dedicates the building known as the old nurses quarters to Head Start purposes and programs rent free for a period of seven years in recognition of the renovation funding that will be required to be expended.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that at the end of the seven years the continued use of the facility rent free by Head Start will be re-evaluated and rent may be charged or the building may be converted to other uses or other appropriate action by the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 16, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (h) (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
