## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the Chief of Police of the Whiteriver Police Department advises the Tribal Council that the Police Department is applying for a grant for approximately \$40,000 from the Indian Highway Safety Program; and
- WHEREAS, said grant will address several areas, including but not limited to:
  - 1. Increased training level of officers for DUI enforcement
  - 2. Mileage fees for a DUI enforcement vehicle and related equipment.
  - Overtime pay for DUI enforcement.
  - 4. The use of a tracking system by tribal agencies for DUI offenders to obtain counseling for them as part of their court agreement or sentence; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the grant application has the support of Tribal Judges, the Tribal Attorney, and Tribal Prosecutor and the IHS; and
- WHEREAS, the application of said grant funds has proven to dramatically reduce the number of traffic fatalities and injuries on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby authorizes Chief of Police Andrew
  Kane of the Whiteriver Police Department to file an
  application for a grant from the Indian Highway Safety
  Program as outlined herein.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman and in his absence, the Vice Chairman, and Chief of Police Andrew Kane and any other tribal official to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate this resolution for the purposes set forth herein.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 16, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
