

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS,** Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr. advises the Tribal Council that the Turkey Creek baseball field road is very dusty and in wet weather becomes very muddy; and
- WHEREAS,** the baseball field was constructed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs but the field still needs grading so that the baseball field can be put to use for the Little League; and
- WHEREAS,** the field has already been surveyed and equipment is needed to level and grade the field and blading and gravel is needed for the road leading to the baseball field; and
- WHEREAS,** Mr. Massey requests, on behalf of the Turkey Creek community that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be requested to level the field and to gravel the road to the field.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that it hereby requests the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency to direct the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department to level the Turkey Creek baseball field and to gravel the road leading to the baseball field.

The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of five for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (h) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
