

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS,** Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr. advises the Tribal Council that Flora White, a tribal member living in East Fork community has requested Tribal Council assistance to direct the Bureau of Indian Affairs to fill in a large crater behind her house which was created by a gravel crushing operation by BIA Roads Department; and
- WHEREAS,** Mrs. White's daughter desires to construct a house behind the crater which would require the crater to be filled; and
- WHEREAS,** the crater is causing erosion and is a danger to health and safety for the White family; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council concurs with the request.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to take immediate steps to fill in the crater created by the BIA Roads Department behind Flora White's home in East Fork and report back to the Tribal Council through Councilmember Randall Massey's office when the work will commence and when it is completed.


The foregoing resolution was on June 16, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (h) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
