## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the governing body on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, is hereby requested by John F. Kennedy Day School Board to waive Indian Preference in consideration of applicants for the position of Principal for the school; and
- whereas, according to the Bureau of Indian Affairs Manual, Education Personnel, 62 BIAM 11.44 Waiver of Indian Preference, the Tribal governing body may waive the Indian preference laws with respect to a specific personnel action regarding a non-Indian employee (already employed) or a job applicant, and such waivers are only to be granted on a case-by-case basis; and
- whereas, the local school board feels it appropriate to request that non-Indian candidates be referred to them for appointment consideration, and, by Resolution No.93-01, attached hereto, requests support of their determination.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports John F. Kennedy Day School Board's determination and waives the Indian preference laws in this instance.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 23, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
