RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Pauline (Ethelbah) Crocker, the aunt of Stephanie Altaha, has come before the Tribal Council complaining about the treatment of her niece in the Whiteriver Jail; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council, after a discussion with Mrs. Crocker, concludes that the Tribal Attorney should inquire about the situation and about the release of Stephanie Altaha from the Whiteriver Jail; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney advises the Tribal Council that Stephanie Altaha is being represented by Apache Legal Aid and that he will contact Legal Aid pursuant to Tribal Council direction about the particulars of the allegations about Stephanie Altaha's treatment in the Jail.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Attorney to inquire about the situation of Stephanie Altaha at the Whiteriver Jail.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>July 14, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 State. 984).
