## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Councilman Johnny Endfield advises the Tribal Council that tribal member Curtis Suttle has been in the Marine Corps for over 21 years and is currently stationed at Camp Pendelton, California; and
- WHEREAS, Master Sergeant Suttle has requested a White Mountain Apache Tribal Flag to display in his office at Camp Pendelton; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council concludes that it would be appropriate to purchase a Tribal Flag for Sergeant Suttle in appreciation for the years of service he has given to his county and his Tribe; and
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby approves the gift of a Tribal Flag
  to be presented to Sergeant Curtis Suttle in honor of his
  years of service in the United States Marine Corps; to
  his country and the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Tribal Treasurer to appropriate funds to purchase the Tribal Flag from the appropriate tribal budget account.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>July 14, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
