

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tribal Council member Kino Kane reports to the Tribal Council that there are several areas within reservation communities in dire need of road repairs; and


WHEREAS, Tribal Council member Kino Kane requests and directs the Bureau of Indian Affairs Branch of Roads to repair and make suitable the ambulance stop area in the Wise Owl area, to construct a cul-du-sac on Seven Mile Road for a bus turnaround, to construct a road for new housing at Fort Apache Junction, to return to Cibecue and continue graveling exit roads to homesites in the community which was suspended during the Tribal Fair, to clear the roadsides of all community roads of brush and weeds, to install cattle guards in the Nash Creek area in Canyon Day as the cattle guards have been delivered but have never been installed; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Council member Kino Kane's request is well justified.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests and directs the Bureau of Indian Affairs Branch of Roads to complete the road repairs, graveling and construction described in this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests the Superintendent of Fort Apache Agency to direct the Chief of the Branch of Roads to carry out the purposes and requests in this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
