

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, representatives from the Canyon Day community have come before the Tribal Council this date and have requested construction of a convenience store in Canyon Day including gas pumps for the convenience of residents in that community as other communities on the Reservation have mini-markets or convenience stores with gas pumps constructed therein; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Chairman advises the Canyon Day representatives of the environmental problem existing at HonDah due to gasoline tanks being improperly prepared in 1988 and that he has initiated a study of other convenience stores in the various communities to ensure that there is no violation of EPA regulations pertaining to gasoline contamination of soil and water; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the request of the Canyon Day Community Representatives for a convenience store should await the results of the study of other mini-markets on the Reservation for gasoline contamination problems.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby concludes that the request of the Canyon Day Community representatives should be reconsidered after completion of the review of existing community mini-markets and gas tanks thereon to ensure that environmental safety concerns for tribal members are met.

The foregoing resolution was on November 03, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
