RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, community buildings necessary for meetings, elderly feeding programs and other community needs in each community within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are in need of renovation and repair; and
- whereas, Tribal Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr. is already in the process of filing an application for the East Fork Community for a grant from the Economic Development Agency of the Federal Government to repair that community's community building; and
- whereas, other communities have likewise requested assistance in filing similar applications; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council concludes that the EDA grant application for the East Fork Community should include all community buildings on the Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the current EDA grant application on behalf of the East Fork community be expanded to include all community buildings for the various communities within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>November 03, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
