RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the preservation and perpetuation of Apache culture is a matter of the highest priority to the Tribal Council; and
- whereas, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been invited to submit an application for funding to the Lila Wallace Reader's Digest Folklife Fund for the development of instruction in the collection of materials, processing of the materials, and their use in making articles traditional to the Apache culture; and
- whereas, the proposed program would identify and compensate elders for sharing their knowledge of traditional Apache cultural articles; and
- WHEREAS, the project has the potential to lend prestige to the efforts of Apache craftsmen by their participation with this Folklife program; and
- WHEREAS, the application requires a Tribal match.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe the \$15,000 be authorized as match for the Lila Wallace - Reader's Digest Folklife Program application.

The foregoing resolution was on November 4, 1993, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b,h,i,j,k,u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
