RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Andrew Kane, Chief of Police of the Whiteriver Police Department, is desirous of increasing the number of law enforcement personnel by increased funding; and
- WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice has recently announced through the Bureau of Justice Assistance a Police Hiring Supplement Program; and
- WHEREAS, this program will supplement up to 75% of an officer's annual salary for three years, but in no case shall the amount exceed \$75,000 per officer over the life of the grant; and
- WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has determined that four additional officers could be hired under this program for a cost of \$240,000 for three years and the tribal cost would be \$60,000, to include fringe benefits for the three years.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman and the Chief of Police Andrew Kane to make application for this grant through the United States Department of Justice.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>November **Q**4, 1993</u>, 1993 duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), and (l) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
