RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the education of the children on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is of the utmost importance to the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") provides certain educational services to the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Acting BIA Education Superintendent for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has been located on the reservation on a "detail" for thirty days; and
- whereas, it is necessary that the Acting Education Superintendent continue his detail assignment on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in order to allow him to form a more complete understanding of the educational needs of the people of the Reservation, to prepare a report addressing those needs and concerns, and to make a report addressing those matters to the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requested to extend, by thirty (30) days, the Acting BIA Education Superintendent, Phil Belone's detail on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 15. 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, including Article IV, Section (a), (c) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
