## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Northern Arizona Council of Governments has convened a series of meetings concerning economic development in northern Arizona; and
- WHEREAS, the consensus of the governmental entities is that a multi-language brochure designed to attract international tourists is the most effective means of a regional effort to increase jobs and employment; and
- WHEREAS, the anchor points for such a brochure are to be the Grand Canyon, Monument Valley, and Fort Apache; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe will be asked to contribute to cover the costs associated with the production, printing, and distribution of the brochure; and
- WHEREAS, the U.S. Forestry Service has announced a small grant program designed to increase international tourism.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Planning Department is hereby instructed to prepare a grant application for \$5,000 to the Forestry Service for the Tribe's part of the brochure to be matched with \$5,000 of Tribal funds.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 05, 1994</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (h), (i), (j), (k), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
