## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a strong interest in the design and quality of the state of Arizona roads which cross the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe has identified crucial improvements which it would like to have completed on these state roads; and
- WHEREAS, the Federal Intermodal Surface Transportation Act of 1991 (ISTEA) provides significant money for road construction on Indian Reservations; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is designated by ISTEA as the agency to administer these funds for Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has in the past contributed funds to state road projects on the Reservation which are administered by the Arizona Department of Transportation for the purpose of adding features to those projects which serve the Tribe's needs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) to permit contribution of ISTEA funds to ADOT projects on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation to secure additional features in ADOT road projects which are specified by the Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the projects which are to be included within the terms of this Intergovernmental Agreement are the realignment of the intersection of State Route 260 and 73 at Hon Dah, and the addition of turn-out lanes at Carrizo and Canyon Day.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>February 24, 1994</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (c), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
