

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**


WHEREAS, Margaret Walker from Tribal Health Education has come before the Tribal Council and requested that April 28, 1994 be designated as Mother Earth Clean-Up Day; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Walker explains to the Council the functions of her office and the efforts that are being made to educate tribal members and residents of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in respect to recycling and environmental issues; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs in the request that April 28, 1994 be designated as Mother Earth Clean-Up Day.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby designates April 28, 1994 as Mother Earth Clean-Up Day.

The foregoing resolution was on April 13, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
