## BRIEFS

- 1. Chairman Lupe called the meeting at 9:48 a.m. with the following members of the Tribal Council present: Vice Chairman Lafe Altaha, Councilmembers Judy Dehose, Nashley Tessay, Sr., Slim Quay, Alvin Declay, Frank Endfield, Jr., Raymond Endfield, Jr., and Herbert Tate. Councilmembers Kino Kane was absent and Randall Massey, Jr. joined the meeting in progress.
- 2. Invocation was offered by Councilmember Slim Quay.
- 3. Roll call was conducted by the Tribal Council Secretary, review of council meeting briefs was tabled.
- 4. Member of the McNary community presented requests to the Tribal Council for adequate housing, paint for homes and use of heavy equipment for clean up.
- 5. Resolution No. <u>04-94-086</u> was adopted granting request of McNary residents; and directing the BIA Law Enforcement & Whiteriver Police Department to investigate non-member tresspassers; finally, that the Office of the Tribal Chairman the feasibility of establishing a sub-station for the Police Department, with a vote of eight for and zero against.
- 6. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-087}$  was adopted granting a homesite lease to Adam and Sherry (Baylish) Truax, with a vote of eight for and zero against.
- 7. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-088}$  was adopted granting a homesite lease to Fernie and Paulette (Gooday) Altaha, with a vote of eight for and zero against.
- 8. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-089}$  was adopted authorizing April 28, 1994 as Mother Earth Clean Up Day for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation as requested by Margaret Baha Walker.
- 9. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-090}$  was adopted authorizing tribal members, Denny, Jr. and Davina (Malone) Parker permission to negotiate purchase of Hondah Homesite #A-73.
- 10. Log cutters for Webb Ways, Jaggo Logging and Earl Logging appeared before the Tribal Council requesting an increase in their rate of pay and full coverage benefits.

- 11. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-091}$  was adopted requesting a rate increase and full coverage benefits be made available to the fallers with a vote of nine for and zero against.
- 12. Resolution No. 04-94-092 was adopted approving the Mount Ord/Ord Creek Timber Sale, with a vote of nine for and zero against.
- 13. The meeting recessed for lunch at 12;10 p.m. and reconvened at 1:49 p.m.
- 14. Councilmember Judy Dehose requested use of the gravel pit above the Beach's resident for use on community roads. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-093}$  was adopted granting her request with a vote of eight for and zero against.
- 15. After presentation of plans, elevation and model of the proposed Executive Office Building, Resolution No. 04-94-094 was adopted authorizing call for bids and construction of the Executive Office Building, with a vote of seven for and two against.
- 16. Resolution No. <u>04-94-095</u> was adopted granting the Middle School Band Booster use of \$3,000.00 of the General Land Claims Fund for 80 students to attend the 65th Annual Durango Fine Arts Music Festival on May 5-7, 1994.
- 17. The Tribal Attorney briefly updated the Tribal Council on the endangered specie act; application for treatment as a separate state; safe, clean water act; replacement of ordinance lost in the fire.
- 18. Agenda item number 8 Firearm Policy approval was removed, since the Whiteriver Police Department has already converted their firearm.
- 19. Resolution No. <u>04-94-096</u> was adopted granting sunrise dance request to Lisa (Nashio) Siow and Neva Nashio as sponsors and Lowell and Margaret (Baha) Walker as co-sponsors during the weekend of August 05-07, 1994 in Whiteriver.
- 20. Resolution No. <u>04-94-097</u> was adopted granting sunrise dance request to John and Neva (Massey) Cosen and Perlinda and Lana Cosen during the week-end of September 09-11, 1994.
- 21. Resolution No. <u>04-94-098</u> was adopted granting sunrise dance request to Lenita Paxson and Michael Fall, Sr. as sponsors and Lee and Shirley PLatt as co-sponsors during the week-end of April 29 May 1, 1994 at Turkey Creek rodeo grounds.
- 22. Resolution No. <u>04-94-099</u> was adopted granting sunrise dance request to Randy and Maria (Adley) Classay as sponsors and Anthony and Virginia (Dillon) Cromwell as co-sponsors during the week-end of August 12-14, 1994 in Seven Mile.

- 23. Resolution No. <u>04-94-100</u> was adopted directing the Tribal Human Resources Division to transfer 200 hours of sick leave from Aaron Tessay to Norma Quintero as requested.
- 24. Resolution No. <u>04-94-101</u> was adopted directing the Tribal Human Resources Division to transfer 40 hours of sick leave from Hupp Sanchez, Jr. to Charlotte Sanchez as requested.
- 25. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-102}$  was adopted classifying the footbridge below the Whiteriver Police Department to Class IV so it may qualify for funding.
- 26. JTPA employees, Sadie Burnette and Lavinia Brawley distributed names of eligible HIP applicants to the Tribal Council for their selection, which they advised is due by Friday, April 15, 1994.
- 27. Tribal member, Alida Antonio addressed the Tribal Council requesting that her opposition to a land assignment to Carlos Riley be recognized. After discussion, Tribal Council concurred in her request.
- 28. Resolution No. <u>04-94-103</u> was adopted approving Land Board Meeting minutes for January 14, 1994; March 25, 1994 and April 08, 1994 with the exception of Carlos Riley which is tabled for further discussion as requested by tribal member, Alida Antonio.
- 29. Resolution No. <u>04-94-104</u> was adopted approving a co-op agreement with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for remeasurement of the continuous forest inventory plots on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation from September 1, 1994 to April 1, 1996.
- 30. Resolution No.  $\underline{04-94-105}$  was adopted approving submission of a grant application for the Vocational Skill Center.
- 31. Tribal Council denied Valarie Price's request for use of reservation land for a 45 day healing ceremony.
- 32. At 3:54 p.m. Chairman Lupe recessed the meeting until the next Council meeting which will be next week.
