## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that tribal member Isabelle Mason's place on the HIP Housing list has been set back due to her moving from District IV to District I where she hoped to be placed in a better position to receive a house; and
- WHEREAS, the move to District I caused Mrs. Mason to be removed from the HIP priority list and be placed much lower on the list; and
- WHEREAS, Isabelle Mason and her family are living in a run-down house in Whiteriver and despairing conditions of her home have caused serious problems for her family and children; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to reaffirm the previous resolution placing Mrs. Mason on the priority listing for HIP Housing.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby reaffirms the previous HIP Housing Resolution for Isabelle Mason whereby she was placed on the high priority list to receive a HIP home.

The foregoing resolution was on May 11, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
