RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, a tribal member, Angela Cheney, advises the Tribal Council that the Indian Health Service placed a water pump on her farmland, with her permission, with the understanding that in exchange, IHS would provide water to her farmland free of charge; and
- WHEREAS, Angela Cheney's farmland is located in the Post Office Canyon area and to date she has no water delivered to her farmland as verbally agreed; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Cheney advises the Council that she does not know who to contact but that she needs water delivered to her farmland as soon as possible.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Indian Health and Tribal Utility Authority to follow up on the verbal agreement with Angela Cheney and deliver water to her farmland as previously agreed to as soon as possible.

The foregoing resolution was on May 11, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
