

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS**, by Resolution No. 02-91-60, dated February 21, 1990 the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requested that Cibecue Community Streets be constructed; and

**WHEREAS**, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency, Branch of Roads has requested rights-of-way for the purpose of construction and maintaining various routes in the Cibecue area; and

**WHEREAS**, said proposed rights-of-way are for the purpose of constructing 2.313 miles of road and streets known as road construction project FAIR CONSOL. NO. 22; and

**WHEREAS**, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous rights-of-way of (1) variable width of 35 feet to 60 feet wide on West Cibecue Subdivision, Cibecue White City Subdivision and Assembly of God Road, (2) 40 feet wide on West Sawmill Subdivision, and (3) 100 feet wide on Cibecue Rodeo Grounds Road as shown on right-of-way drawings as follows:

R/W Dwg. No. FA-310-2	Length = 0.91 mile
R/W Dwg. No. FA-310-3	Length = 0.59 mile
R/W Dwg. No. FA-310-4	Length = 0.50 mile

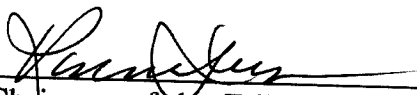
**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous right-of-way as described herein and recorded on Right-of-Way Drawings on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

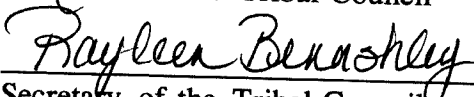
The foregoing resolution was on May 12, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (e), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
