RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has previously objected to a realignment of the Bureau of Indian Affairs which would establish several additional layers of bureaucracy without providing improved services at the local level; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed this position and, while still opposing unnecessary realignments of the Bureau of Indian Affairs which would establish several unnecessary layers of bureaucracy, but believes that there may be benefit to establishing a separate line of authority over BIA education; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed Resolution No. <u>09-92-263</u>, and hereby notes that this position is not consistent with that expressed in that Resolution as it relates to Bureau of Indian Affairs education matters.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby rescinds that portion of the Resolution regarding the opposition of one line authority as it relates to Bureau of Indian Affairs Superintendent of Education.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 01, 1994</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (c), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
