RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the 1.66 million acre Fort Apache Indian Reservation, homeland of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, is blessed with an abundance of natural resources and pristine environment; and
- WHEREAS, historical livestock grazing practices and other human-related disturbances to the land and resources of the Reservation have resulted in some degraded areas in need of restoration and enhancement work, and
- WHEREAS, the need for productive and educational work experiences for young Tribal Members is important to the Reservation population overall, and
- WHEREAS, the tribally-organized Summer Youth Environmental Restoration Program is in need of \$4000 for transportation, \$1500 for participant uniforms and \$1500 for miscellaneous equipment (shovels, rakes, rope, etc.) or a total of \$7000 to effectively carry out its goal of providing valuable training and work to young Tribal Members on projects which restore and enhance the environment of the Reservation.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to provide \$7000 from the Central Tribal General Fund for support of the Summer Youth Environmental Restoration Program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 01, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (g), (h), (i), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
