RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has notified the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribe is eligible to submit applications for up to \$2,000,000 in Indian Community Development Block Grant funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe has met the Citizen Participation requirements prior to submitting a grant application as it has as the applicant:
 - 1. Furnished residents with information concerning amount of funds available and the range of activities to be undertaken;
 - 2. Held one or more public hearings to obtain the views of residents;
 - 3. Developed and published or posted a community development statement which gives affected residents an opportunity to review it and comment on it;
 - 4. Given residents an opportunity to review and comment on the applicant's performance under any previous community development block grant.
 - 5. Considered public comments and, if deemed appropriate, modified the application accordingly;
 - 6. Made the modified application available to residents; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe elects to submit demographic data that is not generally available to meet the application process; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council in accordance with 24 CFR 571.300 (c) finds that:
 - 1. Generally available, published data are substantially incorrect or incomplete;
 - 2. The data to be provided has been collected systematically and are statistically reliable;
 - 3. The data is to the greatest extent possible independently verifiable;
- The data differentiates between the Reservation and BIA service area population.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache that grant applications for the completion of the Apache Cultural Education Facility and the Hon-Dah RV Park be submitted to HUD for ICDBG funding.

The foregoing resolution was on July 14, 1994 duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
