RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, tribal member, Alice Quintero has come before the Tribal Council and has advised that the road from her home to her mother, Sara Massey's home, was closed due to danger to residents because the road was so close to the home; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Quintero requests Tribal Council authority to unblock the road so as to provide a shortcut to her mother's home; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council concludes that authorization should be granted to unblock the road, but that the BIA Roads Department should engineer the road in such a way as to eliminate any dangerous conditions for pedestrians or motor vehicles.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the BIA Roads Department to unblock the short cut road from Alice Quintero's house to her mother, Sara Massey's home, and to engineer the road to eliminate any dangerous conditions to pedestrians or motor vehicle traffic.

The foregoing resolution was on August 03, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
