

13. TIME AND METHODS OF LEGALLY TAKING GAME

- A. Big game, except, elk may be legally taken with the following weapons:
 - Centerfire rifles, muzzleloading rifles, and all other rifles using black powder or Pyrodex.
 - Centerfire handguns and handguns using black powder or Pyrodex.
 - 3. Shotguns shooting slugs.
 - 4. Bows having a standard pull of forty or more pounds, using arrows with metal broadheads no less than 7/8 inch width cutting edges.
 - 5. In addition, Javelina may be taken with 22 rimfire magnum rifles and 5mm rimfire rifles.
- B. Small game (EXCEPT MIGRATORY BIRDS, BLUE GROUSE AND QUAIL) may be legally taken with any firearm, bow and arrow, pneumatic weapon, or sling shot not prohibited in Section F.
- C. Migratory birds and upland game birds may be taken only with shotguns shooting shot or bow and arrow not prohibited in Section F.
- D. Other mammals and birds may be legally taken during the season by any means not prohibited in Section F except for foothold traps.

- E. The following devices and ammunition are prohibited for the taking of ANY wildlife on the Reservation and may not be possessed in the field while hunting:
 - 1. Fully automatic firearms, including firearms capable of selective automatic fire.
 - 2. Tracer ammunition and full metal jacketed bullets other than those designed for hunting.
 - 3. Shotguns larger than 10 gauge; or shotguns capable of holding more than two shells in the magazine, unless plugged with a one-piece filler, incapable of removal without disassembling the gun.



Proposal to Develop a Trophy Merriam's Turkey Hunting Program

Introduction:

Over the last 20 years, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has developed, perhaps the most renown trophy elk hunting program in the world. The demand for the opportunity to hunt trophy elk has increased considerably in recent years, with the demand and interest remaining exceptionally high. The department continues to explore other alternatives to develop high quality and economically feasible hunting programs, while ensuring that the tribal needs and opportunities are likewise met. After reviewing current population status and trends for various potential game species on the reservation, plus the interest and demand for high quality hunting experiences, we feel that spring gobbler hunts hold extremely high potential.

Justification:

Like trophy elk hunting, spring gobbler hunts for turkey have become increasingly popular, particularly for high quality With declining opportunities on public hunting experiences. lands throughout the southwest, private ranches and several Indian Tribes have entered into hunting programs specifically for spring gobblers. While the majority of the hunting programs which are currently underway are geared primarily toward providing hunting opportunities to the general public, we are aware of only one program, at Vermejo Park, N.M., which provides package hunts. The attached prospectus, which provides an overview of selected spring gobbler hunts available in the southwest, shows the number of tags normally issued, cost of those permits and the income The current demand is so great that tags are they generate. normally sold out.

Turkey populations typically fluctuate from year to year. On the reservation, numbers likewise respond to habitat and weather changes. The fluctuations are however less dramatic than other parts of their range. The turkey population on the reservation is considered as increasing. Based on recent trend data, the overall numbers suggest an upward trend. The numbers compiled during summer surveys show and increase of nearly 60 % in the number of turkey counted in the Maverick area, while the Paradise area reflected a 20 % increase.

The overall impacts from tribal turkey hunting have been insignificant. By far the greatest amount of hunting effort by tribal members occurs during the fall season. During this period the department issues over 4000 tribal turkey tags. The hunter success normally is low, approximately 5 percent, which means out of a potential harvest of 4000 turkeys, only 200 are killed, with other mortality factors taking the remainder of the annual loss.

The department, over the years has also issued 175 spring gobbler tags each year to tribal members. Although interest has steadily increased, nonetheless the desire to hunt turkey in the spring is not as great as in the fall. This year to continue meeting the growing interest from tribal members, the department has increased the number of spring gobbler tags available from 175 to 250.

Based on current population trends and harvest rates for both fall and spring tribal hunts, the take of an additional 30 to 50 turkeys in the spring would be insignificant.

Proposal:

The department proposes to develop a trophy-quality hunting program for spring gobblers. Other hunting programs in the southwest have shown the overall success of spring turkey hunting as well as the potential economic benefits they provide. Because of the reservation's reputation as providing high quality hunting experiences, the basic intent under this proposal is to continue that reputation for turkey hunting as well.

Recognizing this, the department is therefore recommending a very limited spring gobbler hunt which will promote a high quality experience for non-tribal hunters. This program will feature packaged spring gobbler hunts, which will include food, lodging and guide services for a 3 day hunt. As an added bonus, perhaps one black bear could also be included. This in affect would help in stabilizing bear numbers, as well as hopefully reducing the growing conflicts with black bear on the reservation. Provided below are recommended numbers of tags for consideration by the council, as well as, the cost of each tag and the projected income those tags will generate.

10. MIGRATORY BIRDS
TO BE ANNOUNCED

ALL TRIBAL MEMBERS HUNTING MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS MUST HAVE A VALID FEDERAL DUCK STAMP IN POSSESSION.

11. METHODS OF LEGALLY TAKING GAME

- A. All big game except elk may be legally taken with the following weapons:
 - Centerfire rifles, muzzleloading rifles, and all other rifles using black powder or Pyrodex.
 - 2. Centerfire handguns and handguns using black powder or Pyrodex.
 - 3. Shotguns shooting slugs.
 - 4. Bows having a standard pull of forty or more pounds, using arrows with metal broadheads no less than 7/8 inch width cutting edges.
- B. Elk may be <u>legally</u> taken with the following weapons:
 - Centerfire rifles having a caliber of 270 or greater. (Legal calibers include: 270, 284, 7 Win. Mag., 30-30, 300 savage, 308, 30-06, 300 win. mag.) (Illegal calibers include: 22, 22 mag., 5mm, 222, 22-250, 6mm, 243, 25-06, 264 win. mag.)
 - Bows having a standard pull of fifty or more pounds, using arrows with metal broadheads no less than 7/8 inch width cutting edges.
- C. Small game (EXCEPT MIGRATORY BIRDS, BLUE GROUSE AND QUAIL) may be legally taken with any firearm, bow and arrow, pneumatic weapon, or sling shot not prohibited in Section G.
- D. Predatory and fur-bearing animals may be legally taken with any firearm, bow and arrow, or trap not prohibited in Section G.

- E. Migratory birds and upland game birds may be taken only with shotguns shooting shot or bow and alrow hot prohibited in Section G.
- F. Other mammals and birds may be legally taken during the season by any means not prohibited in Section G except for foothold traps.
- G. The following devices and ammunition are prohibited for the taking of ANY wildlife on the Reservation and may not be possessed in the field while hunting:
 - 1. Fully automatic firearms, including firearms capable of selective automatic lire.
 - Tracer ammunition and full metal jacketed bullets other than those designed for hunting.
 - 3. Shotguns larger than 10 gauge; or shotguns capable of holding more than two shells in the magazine, unless plugged with a one-piece filler, incapable of removal without disassembling the qun.
 - 4. Semi-automatic centerfire rifles with a magazine capacity of more than five shells.
 - 5. Contrivances designed to silence, muffle, or minimize the report of a firearm.
 - 6. Poisoned arrows, or arrows with explosive tips.
 - Crossbows and other bows having devices attached to hold the bow in drawn position are prohibited.
 - 8. The use of artificial light to spotlight wild animals or birds is illegal (except for raccoons).
 - 9. Rifles and shotguns less than 24 inches in length.

12. TIME PERIODS FOR THE TAKING OF GAME

- Big game, wild mammals, and birds may be taken only during daylight hours (sunrise to sunset).
- Nongame mammals, predatory, and fur-bearing animals may be taken by trap day or night.
- 3. Migratory game birds may be taken only at such

Migratory Game Bird Regulations.

13. TAGGING AND TRANSPORTING OF BIG GAME

- All hunters shall have in their possession a valid tribal hunting tag prior to going into the field to hunt. <u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>. Anyone found hunting without a valid tag will be cited.
- Tags will be properly affixed to the game species immediately after the kill.
- All game must have head attached during transporting from field.

14. SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Non-members (anyone who is not a registered member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe) may not be in the field with Tribal Members during the hunting season. Exempt from this are immediate family members such as husband, wife, children, brothers sisters.
- 2. All hunting tags must be picked up in person. Tribal I.D. card or affidavit of membership (from B.I.A. or Tribal Council Secretary) must be presented at the time tags are purchased. Except for Special drawing hunts, permits will be issued to physically handicapped and senior citizens (55) free of charge.
- 3. Duplicate tags will be issued at a cost of \$5.00 per tag. No duplicate tags will be issued for special drawing permits.
- During the 199 hunting season, wearing of blaze hunter orange will be required.
- 5. Juveniles 12 and 13 years old, may obtain a big game hunting permit; following the successful completion of a hunter education course.

WHILE THE TROPHY ELK HUNT IS IN PROGRESS (SEPTEMBER 1 THRU OCTOBER 10, 1991), ALL UNITS EXCEPT UNITS 7 AND 10 ARE CLOSED TO HUNTING.

These regulations shall apply to all tribal members and to those non-members who have been granted hunting rights by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

Tags for hunting and trapping must be obtained from the White Mountain Apache Game & Fish Office in Whiteriver prior to hunting.

Office hours for picking up tags and making applications are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon - 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

A designated location will be available in the Cibecue are where hunt applications can be filed. Dates, times and locations will be announced on the radio.

- 4. Semi-automatic centerfire rifles with a magazine capacity of more than five shells.
- 5. Contrivances designed to silence, muffle, or minimize the report of a firearm.
- 6. Poisoned arrows, or arrows with explosive tips.
- Crossbows and other bows having devices attached to hold the bow in a drawn position are prohibited.
- 8. The use of artificial light to spotlight wild animals or birds is illegal.

14. TIME PERIODS FOR THE TAKING OF GAME

- A. Big game, wild mammals, and birds may be taken only during daylight hours (sunrise to sunset).
- B. Migratory game birds may be taken only at such times as authorized by the Tribal Council in the Migratory Game Bird Regulations.

15. TAGGING OF BIG GAME

- A. All hunters shall have in their possession a valid tribal hunting tag prior to going into the field to hunt. NO EXCEPTIONS. Anyone found hunting without a valid tag will be cited.
- B. Tags will be properly affixed to the game species immediately after the kill.

16. SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- A. While the Trophy Elk Hunt is in progress (SEPTEMBER 1 THRU OCTOBER 7/1997), all hunting units except units 7 and 10 are closed to all hunting.
- B. These regulations shall apply to all non-members (Anyone who is not a registered member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe).
- C. Tags for big game hunting must be obtained from the White Mountain Apache Game & Fish Office in Whiteriver prior to going into the field.
- D. Tags for Small Game hunting may be purchased from any Reservation permit dealer.
- E. Anyone hunting Bandtail Pigeon on the White Mountain Indian Reservation must have a special Tribal Bandtail Permit in their possession along with a valid Tribal Small Game Hunting Permit. The Bandtail Permit is available at any Rese vation permit dealer at no cost.
- F. Anyone hunting Migratory Birds on the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation must have a special Tribal Migratory Bird Permit in their possession along with a valid Tribal Small Game Hunting Permit and a Federal Duck Stamp. The Migratory Bird permit is available at any Reservation permit dealer at no cost.
- G. Elk may be legally taken with the following weapons:
 - Centerfire rifles having a caliber of 270 or greater.
 - 2. Bows having a standard pull of 50 or more pounds, using arrows with metal broadheads no less than 7/8 inch width cutting edges. Crossbows are not allowed.
