RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has previously authorized and requested the Bureau of Indian Affairs to conduct appraisals of homes financed by the Farmers Home Administration; and
- WHEREAS, a BIA appraisal is necessary to determine the value of the home for purposes of tribal financing or repurchase by tribal members through the Tribal Revolving Credit Program; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to conduct appraisals of fifteen (15) Farmers Home Administration homes on the Reservation for the Tribal Revolving Credit office.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests Fort Apache Agency Superintendent Ben Nuvamsa to direct agency staff to prepare appraisals for fifteen (15) Farmers Home Administration homes on the Reservation, said homes to be identified by the Tribal Revolving Credit office.

The foregoing resolution was on October 05, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (h), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
