

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** Mr. Gordon Krutz, former Coordinator of Indian Programs at the University of Arizona, acting on behalf of Dr. Paul Skinner, has come before the Tribal Council this date with a request that the Council support the self-empowerment leadership focus [SELF] program, which is sponsored by the University of Arizona College of Medicine; and

**WHEREAS,** the SELF program provides training that will empower Tribal participants to identify, develop and implement their ideas for solving some of the social, health and educational problems in their communities; and


**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council concludes that the project is extremely worthwhile and will be helpful to adult and youth members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and that the Tribal Council should authorize and support the proposal.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses and supports the SELF program as explained to the Council by Mr. Gordon Krutz acting on behalf of Dr. Paul Skinner of the University of Arizona Medical Center.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it authorizes and supports the grant for the SELF proposal and directs the Tribal Education and Health Committee to select participants for the SELF program.

The foregoing resolution was on February 1, 1995, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
