

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS,** Councilman Johnny Endfield advises the Tribal Council that the Law and Order Committee recommends that the tribal court, juvenile court, tribal prosecutor and juvenile prosecutor offices be consolidated in the same building to provide for a more efficient tribal court system; and
- WHEREAS,** the present tribal court building does not have sufficient space to house all of the judicial offices; and
- WHEREAS,** the Law and Order Committee recommends that the Planning and Engineering Department be directed to look into finding a larger building for the tribal courts; and
- WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council agrees that the tribal judicial offices should be located in the same building.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Planning and Engineering Department to assist the tribal courts in locating a larger building which would be adequate to house the tribal court, juvenile court, tribal prosecutor, juvenile prosecutor and other court staff.

The foregoing resolution was on February 1, 1995, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


